



Dear Parents and Carers,

We have our meet and greet parent teacher interviews on February 28th. You would have received a letter about the Meet and Greet interviews through Compass, explaining the process for the interviews and for making an interview time. Please log onto Compass to book a time to meet with your child's classroom teacher and if you like, their specialist teachers. Interviews will be held in your child's classroom and specialist teachers will be having their interviews in their rooms – PE will be in the Library. As the preps have not been at school on Wednesdays, some children may not yet have had their PE/French/Art classes. We look forward to seeing you at these interviews as they provide the opportunity for you to share important information with your child's new teacher and to set up some learning goals, providing a great opportunity for families and staff to get to know each other a little more and to continue to build on our strong home-school partnerships, benefiting our students.

We would like to remind families that the Department of Education and Training does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. We highly recommend that families have their own Ambulance coverage/insurance, and please ensure that we have up to date details at the front office in case of an emergency.

At our school council meeting last Thursday, our Annual Implementation Plan was endorsed. We have set goals in improving outcomes in English for all children and building our school community.

Attendance

At Tarneit Rise Primary School EVERY LEARNING MINUTE COUNTS!

In just over three weeks, our preps have been learning the letters, and sounds, of the alphabet, how to write their names using correct pencil grip and letter formation, when to use upper and lower case letters, the vowels, how to hear sounds and syllables in words! They have learned the routines of school – how to come into school and get organised for the day's learning, how to line up and play, how to make friends and what respectful listening is. That's A LOT of

learning in two weeks! Every minute is precious and filled with learning opportunities. We want children to be at school every day so they can be the best they can be.

Cumulative absence has a negative impact on student learning and we must work together to have children at school every day. Missing even one day a fortnight, can have a massive impact on learning, and that is why we must phone families, to follow up, on absences and why we will not be approving extended family holidays as children will be missing important learning. **Please invest in your child's education and future outcomes by booking family holidays during the school holidays.**

Just a few friendly reminders:

- Please ensure you have booked a 'Meet and Greet' for next Wednesday through Compass. If you are having any difficulties with this, please see our lovely ladies in reception.
- Please ensure your child has their hat at school every day. For your child's safety, we follow a 'no hat, no play' policy. If your child does not have a hat, they will be directed to stay in the shade during recess and lunch.
- The doors for both learning pod 1 and 2 will remain locked prior to 8:45 am and 3:10 pm each day. We greatly value learning time at Tarneit Rise, so please see that your child is at school when the music begins. Teachers use the first 10 minutes in the morning to mark the roll and organise the daily schedule, so should you require to speak to your child's teacher, please arrange to do so after school so that we can chat without interruptions.

Homework:

By now your child would have been allocated a day to change over their reading books. On this day, your child will receive three new books, which they will read with your assistance over the week. If you have books at home, you are more than welcome to read these also. Please fill in the yellow reading log each day so that we can all work together to keep track of how many books have been read.

In addition to the reading, an alphabet sheet has been sent home so that students can practise their automatic recall of the letters. Please practise saying each of the letters each night. In class we have been practising identifying capital letters, lower case letters and the vowels. If you would like to further extend your child an idea would be to ask them questions regarding these.

Compass


All families should have their Compass log on. If you have not received this yet please see the office.

Remember, **Tuesday** is School Banking day and students should bring in their weekly deposit.

For every deposit made at school, students will receive a silver Dollarmites token. Once students have individually collected 10 tokens they can redeem them for an exclusive School Banking reward item in recognition of their regular savings habits.

School Banking is also a great fundraiser for our school. Our school receives a Regular Savers Contribution of \$5 for every 10 deposits processed per student as well as an Annual Contribution which is based on the number of students who made at least one School Banking deposit in the prior year.

If your child has lost their book, they can bring their money to school in a sealed envelope with a note on the next School Banking day. We will issue them with a replacement.
